Keynote Speakers



Janet Rich-Edwards is co-director of the science program at the Radcliffe Institute, associate professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School, and associate professor in the department of epidemiology at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. As an epidemiologist, her focus is on the intersection of women's health and that of their children, and she is the director of developmental epidemiology for the Connors Center for Women's health and gender biology at Brigham and Women's Hospital.



George Davey Smith is director of the MRC Integrative Epidemiology Unit at the University of Bristol and scientific director of the Avon Longitudinal Study of Parents and Children. As a clinical epidemiologist, his research has pioneered the understanding of health inequalities, lifecourse epidemiology, health care and health policy interventions and the utilization of genetics in epidemiology and population health.



Jon Michael Gran is an associate professor and researcher at the Oslo Centre for Biostatistics and Epidemiology, a joint centre between the Department of Biostatistics at the University of Oslo and the Oslo University Hospital. He is also associate editor in *Biometrika*, and works on methods for causal inference.
